


Horizon Europe Framework Programme




Key figures: Horizon Europe is well underway



Proposal success rates and quality increased






Proposal success rate increased from 11.9% to 16.4% under Horizon Europe

54% of all proposals were marked as high-quality proposals under Horizon Europe(was **46%** in Horizon 2020)



Over 20% of total funding so far allocated to SMEs



Pillar II involves 70% of all SME unique participants and provides 68% of all EU contribution for SMEs (EUR4.7 billion). Approximately 15% of the joint undertakings funding went to SMEs

The EIC grants provided EUR1.8 billion for SMEsmore than any other programme part.

The **EIC Fund** approved equity investments for start-ups and SMEs- adding **EUR 1.7 billion** for SMEs, totalling the investments to **9.1 billion** (20.3% of EUR44.9 billion total funding, including the approved equity investments.) Excluding equity investments, SMEsreceived 17% of programme funding.



Horizon Europe legislation defines three types of impact tracked through Impact Pathways

- 1. Creating highquality new knowledge
- 2. Strengthening human capital in R&I
- 3. Fostering diffusion of knowledge and Open Science

- 4. Addressing EU policy priorities & global challenges through R&I
- 5. Delivering benefits & impact via R&I missions
- 6. Strengthening the uptake of R&I in society

Societal Impact



- 7. Generating innovatiobased growth

Work Programme 2025

- Adopted on 14 May 2025
- Published in Official Journal and opening of first calls on 15 May
- Result of an intensive co-creation and co-design process
- In line with the research and innovation priorities outlined in the Horizon
 Europe strategic plan for 2025-2027 (the green transition, the digital
 transition and a more resilient, competitive, inclusive and democratic
 Europe).
- In line with the EU's main policy priorities as set out in the Commission's Political Guidelines for 2024-2029

Horizon Europe Work Programme 2025


Topics to be funded include:

- Encouraging the development of Al
- Supporting the <u>EUMissions</u> and the <u>NewEuropeanBauhaus</u> Facility
- ChooseEurope for Science to attract promising talent through the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions

Out of the total €7.3 billion investment:

- 35% is dedicated for climate action
- 8.8% for biodiversity
- 36% for the digital transition









The Horizon Europe 'main' work programme 2026-2027

'Main' work programme 2026-2027: Context

- Last work programme under Horizon Europe 2021-2027
- In line with the <u>Strategic Plan 2025-2027</u> key strategic orientations:
 - Green transition
 - Digital transition
 - A more resilient, competitive, inclusive and democratic Europe
- In line with the **European Commission priorities** (2024-2029):
 - Sustainable prosperity and competitiveness
 - Security and defence
 - Supporting people, strengthening our societies and our social model
 - Sustaining our quality of life
 - Protecting our democracy, upholding our values
 - A global Europe



'Main' work programme 2026-2027: indicative planning

- Q4 2024-Q3 2025: Preparation of draft work programme 2026-2027 in co-creation within the Commission and co-design with Member States/Associated countries in line with the Horizon Europe Strategic Plan 2025-2027 and the political priorities
- Q4 2025: Formal consultation of the Horizon Europe Programme Committee configurations and procedural steps towards adoption
- December 2025: Expected adoption of the 'main' work programme 2026-2027

A continued effort towards simplification

- Less prescriptive topic descriptions and fewer topics resulting in an expected reduction of the overall length of the work programme text
- Increased use of lump sum funding with the aim to simplify financial management and reduce administrative burden for participants
- Use of topics with two stage evaluations where relevant allowing applicants to submit a shorter summary proposal and submit a full proposal only if successful in the first stage
- Reduced complexity of the proposal template



The Republic of Armenia in Horizon Europe – cut-off date 17 October 2025



144 ELIGIBLE PROPOSALS

- 177 proposals in total
- Success rate of 12.02%



26 SIGNED GRANTS

- Out of 28 Participations
- 1 SME participation from Armenia with an EU financial contribution of EUR 0.3 million




EUR 8.1 MIO. CONTRIBUTION



- Regulation establishing Horizon Europe including the rules for participation and dissemination (as required by the Treaty)
- Specific programme to implement 'Horizon Europe' (as required by the Treaty)
- Impact assessment (European Competitiveness Fund, ECF)
- Complemented by the Regulation for the ECF, including Specific Programme for Defence
- ... and by the Performance Framework for the Union programmes and activities



The structure of the new Horizon Europe










